Make Your Own "Toad Abode"!

Toads help maintain a healthy ecosystem by eating insects and slugs. Spring is right around the corner! Invite toads to your backyard by giving them a little place in the shade.



What you need:

Small, plastic container (can be a food container: yogurt, cream cheese, etc. *Reduce, Reuse, Recycle*!)

Scissors

Washable, non-toxic paint & paint brushes

Fallen leaves (optional)

Medium-sized rock (optional)

How-to:

- 1. Wash out your plastic container.
- **2.** Using scissors, cut out a small, half-oval shape about 3" high on one side of the container to make a door (see photo example).
- **3.** Paint your toad house! Use washable, non-toxic paint to decorate. Natural colors work best to blend-in outside.
- **4.** Let the paint dry.
- **5.** Pick out a shady spot in your garden, next to a bush or long-hanging tree.
- **6.** Make sure it is near a water source. If you are not near a water source, you can sink a small dish in the soil and keep it filled with water.
- **7.** Place your toad house in the soil, so the opening touches the ground.
- **8.** Sink your toad house about 1-2" deep. Make sure it is sturdy and does not wiggle.
- **9.** If you have leaves in your yard, you can add a few to line the inside of your toad house.
- 10. For extra support, place a heavy object, like a rock, on the top of the toad house.
- **11.** You are all done! Now, you can wait for a toad to move into their new residence!
