Make a Pinecone Bird Feeder

This easy craft can attract birds to your backyard!

What you need:

Large pinecone with large openings

Peanut butter (smooth is best)

Twine

Wild birdseed



What to do:

- 1. Collect your pinecone from outside. If you can't find one outside, you can most likely purchase one at the nearest dollar store.
- 2. Cut a piece of twine that is about a foot long and tie it in a knot at the top of the pinecone. Tie the two loose ends together to make a loop.
- 3. Place your pinecone on a paper towel. Spread peanut butter on the pinecone in an even layer using a butter knife. Make sure to leave the tips of the top and bottom of the pinecone peanut butter free.
- 4. Fill a bowl with birdseed.
- 5. Dip and roll your peanut butter pinecone in the birdseed. Roll it around until the seed evenly covers it.
- 6. Find a branch to hang it outside and wait and see if birds come!
