## What you need

- A collection of recycled cardboard packaging
- Colourful tissue paper
- PVA glue

## Instructions

1 hour

1. Collect some cardboard recycled materials and packaging. Food packaging, egg boxes, cereal boxes and coffee cup carriers all work well.

- 2. Arrange your recycled materials until you think you have a great Gorilla face. You can take time over this to make sure you are happy with your results. Use a picture of a gorilla to help you; but your mask doesn't need to be realistic!
- 3. Stick down the gorilla features with strong glue and leave to dry.
- 4. Have fun decorating with pieces of colourful tissue and other found craft materials. Make your Gorilla as colourful as you like!
