LANTERN LIGHTING IN THE JAPANESE GARDEN & FROG POND

The Japanese Obon Festival is reminiscent of Japan's annual Obon holiday, an important cultural and family event. During this holiday it is said that ancestral spirits revisit their families for three days. Many people will return home to pay their respects at gravesites, and often small paper lanterns are lit and floated down the river to guide ancestor's spirits. The Obon Festival also features the Bon Odori, or folk dance, in which all are invited to join in the circle and dance.

Lantern launching in the Japanese Garden & Frog Pond will begin immediately after the Bon Odori performance. The Japanese Garden gate will open from the festival grounds around 8pm to view the lanterns. We ask that NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY take place in the Japanese Garden when it opens. We want visitors to enjoy their experience without the distraction of flash photography. Thank you for your understanding.


